

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#### 1. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

1.1 The Organising Authority (OA) is listed in Table 1.

#### 2. RULES

The event will be governed by the rules as defined in the World Sailing Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024, Appendix D, TEAM RACING RULES.

#### 3. CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to the SI will be posted on the Official Notice Board or distributed to all teams not later than 30 minutes before they will take effect, except that any change to the time schedule of races will be posted at least two hours before it will take effect, and competitors will be notified.
- 3.2 Oral changes may be given either on the water, by the Umpires or ashore.

#### 4. VENUE

4.1 The venue will be the venue identified in Map 1.

#### 5. EVENT FORMAT

- 5.1 The regatta is a short course umpired fleet racing event. Each race will be sailed in classidentical one-design boats. Teams race the boats continuously.
- 5.2 The regatta will consist of a minimum of 3 races. The winner of the regatta will be the team with the LEAST points.
- 5.3 There shall be no maximum number of races. It will be at Race Management's discretion as to when the last heat is conducted.

#### 6. TEAMS

- 6.1 Each team shall consist ideally of four or five crew. Please advise Race Management if there are planned changes to this number.
- 6.2 Each team shall nominate a skipper who shall helm the boat at all times while racing, except in an emergency. Changes to crew can be made at any time with notification being made to Race Management.

#### 7. PROGRAM

7.1 A provisional program below is attached.

#### 8. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 8.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on Signal Mast identified in Table 1.
- 8.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 20 minutes" in the RRS Race Signal AP. This changes Race Signals.

#### 9. CLASS FLAG

9.1 The Class Flags are identified in Table 1.

#### 10. RACE AREA


10.1 The Race Area is identified in Map 2.

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#### 11. COURSE

The course shall be Windward - Leeward: One lap starboard rounding.

P Flag will commence countdown to next race. Use the time between races to celebrate gains made, accept and understand losses made and, to strategize the next race.



#### **12. ROUNDING MARKS**

12.1 Weather Mark will be YELLOW conical.

#### **13. START AND FINISH LINES**

- 13.1 Pin start mark will ORANGE conical. Boat end of line will be CYC1 flying Flag "H"
- 13.2 There shall be no recalls. If a boat(s) is deemed over the line at the start, it will be at the discretion of the PRO and or the Chief Umpire to signal a penalty by way of a whistle and boat number declaration. The offending boat(s) must then do one complete 360 degree penalty turn.

#### 14. STARTING SEQUENCE

Races will be started using the TRAFFIC LIGHT system as described below.

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#### 15. BOAT ALLOCATION LIST AND CHANGEOVER

15. 1The Boat Allocation List will be published prior to the first Warning Signal of the first race of the day on which it takes effect.

#### **16. SUPPLIED EQUIPMENT**

Substitution of damaged or lost equipment and repairs may only be done by the Organising

### Authority repairer, or under their management.

#### 17. DIRECTIONS BY RACE COMMITTEE AND UMPIRES

Competitors shall follow the directions of the Race Committee and Umpires.

#### **18. TARGET TIMES**

- 18.1 The target time for each race is between 10 15 minutes.
- 18.2 Point of Certainty: The PRO may at any pint on the race course finish a race by sounding 2 signals and flying Code Flag N...This race WILL COUNT FOR RESULTS.

#### **19. PROTESTS**

19.1 All racing will be subject to the Racing Rules of Sailing. Decisions made by on water judges will be final and not subject to redress. Any challenge may result in instant DSQ for that race

#### 20. SCORING/BOAT ALLOCATION

20.1 The scoring format for the series will be as per below, using Low Points system.

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#### 21. SAFETY

- 21.1 Each crew member must wear a personal flotation device when afloat. Except while briefly changing or adjusting personal clothing. Wet suits and dry suits are not considered as a personal flotation device.
- 21.2 A team that retires from a race shall notify one of the umpires as soon as possible.
- 21.3 The Venue may include prohibited areas. These areas are deemed as Obstructions. The restricted areas will be identified at the Competitors Briefing.
- 21.4 All boats are to keep their radios on at all times using Channel 77. Countdown to the starts, running commentary and on water protest decisions will be conveyed through this channel. In the event that channel 77 becomes unsuitable, channel 73 will be used.

#### 22. OFFICIAL BOATS

- 22.1 The official boats will be marked with the following flags:
  - (a) Signal Vessel: "Code Flag H when on station

#### 23. COMMUNICATIONS [SP]

24. Unless otherwise provided by the Organising Authority, while racing, a team shall not use any electronic devices except a watch for timing the start.

#### 25. COACH AND SUPPORT BOATS [SP]

- 24.1 Coaching and/or support boats are allowed subject to approval by the OA.
- 24.2 Coaches and/or mentors may be allowed on the boat whilst racing subject to approval by the OA, and may be allowed to helm the boat, subject to approval of the OA.

#### 25. MEDIA, IMAGES, SOUND [SP]

- 25.1 If required by the OA
  - (a) Media personnel and equipment shall be carried on board while racing.
  - (b) Competitors may be asked to wear microphones and cameras during racing and be available for interviews when requested.
- 25.2 The OA has the right to use any images and sound recorded during the event free of charge.

#### 26 SKIPPER'S RESPONSIBILITY

26.1 The responsibility for the decision to participate in a race or to continue with it is solely with the skipper; to that extent the skipper also accepts full responsibility for the crew. The skipper is responsible for the qualification and the correct nautical conduct of the crew. Attention is drawn to RRS 3.

#### 27 USE OF CODE FLAG Y (yankee) BY SKIPPER


